As we know, there is no single, "right" path to and through higher education; especially for first-generation students where complex factors further complicates decisions that are difficult for all students. Commute or dorm? PWI (predominately white institution) or MSI (minority serving institution)? Community college, liberal arts college, university? How to weigh costs, prestige, and/or distance. Our students were able to ask pertinent questions relevant to their respective situations.
