With the help of these Passaic "near-peer" mentors and the More Than Bootstraps' program, these four Fellows, now graduating seniors, gained confidence, communication, and leadership skills; researched; navigated the world of college applications, financial aid, and scholarships; and communicated their goals and ambitions with their families.

Jennifer has committed to Montclair State University, where she will study psychology. Marisol will begin her higher education career at Passaic County Community College, pursuing her passion for studio art. Ashley has matriculated at William Paterson University, where she will study criminology and criminal justice. All the students have received merit- and need-based aid to cover their full tuition costs. Catherine is still finalizing her college decision.

The celebration also featured **Rogreka Clayton**, who is celebrating her graduation from William Paterson University as an athletic training major. Reka also joined More Than Bootstraps when it first launched; she was one of the first-generation college students from Passaic who served as a Leader in the program, giving back to her community while solidifying her own success in higher education.
