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More Than Bootstraps Encourages First-Generation Students to Consider Study Abroad Opportunities

Jocelyn was selected because of her excellent academic performance and because she possesses the professional and personal disposition to represent the United States as a student ambassador. We also applaud **Claudia Severino**, a More Than Bootstraps founding board member, who will be a presenter at the <u>We Represent 2021 Virtual International Exchange Conference</u>. The two-day conference (March 10-12, 2021) is designed to build awareness of U.S. government exchange programs through information sessions and panel discussions and to facilitate networking between advisors, alumni, and potential applicants. Claudia, a first-generation college graduate herself, was a norm-breaker. She studied abroad during college in Peru as a Gilman scholar, and she taught in Colombia as Fulbright fellow.
